Reservations: You must call the hotel at 1-800-262-7799, ask for “reservations”, and request the “Native Peoples Native Homelands Workshop” block. The room rate is \$79.00, plus 6.875% tax per night for single or double occupancy. There is a \$10 charge for each additional person. A maximum of 5 people per room is allowed. The minimum age to rent a room is **21 years of age** and a photo ID is required at check in. Check in time is 3:00 PM and check out time is 11:00 a.m. The cut- off date for reservations under this room block is **October 27, 2009**.

Reimbursement
